Subject: Designates the James M. Hough Memorial Highway

The Ohio Department of Transportation (ODOT) will incur about \$350 to \$400 in costs for producing and installing a set of signs indicating this memorial highway. Specifically, the bill designates the southbound stretch of I-71 between mile marker 102 and mile marker 100 within Franklin County as the James M. Hough Memorial Highway. Since this is an interstate route, ODOT is responsible for producing and installing the signs. Once the signs are installed, there are typically no maintenance costs unless they are damaged. Signs usually need to be replaced every 12 to 15 years.
