The Ohio Department of Transportation (ODOT) will incur about \$350 to \$400 in costs for producing and installing signs for this memorial highway. Specifically, the bill designates the northbound and southbound lanes of State Route 743 between the intersection of State Route 222 and where State Route 743 spans Big Indian Creek within Clermont County as the SGT Richard E. Wagner Memorial Highway.

If a memorial marker is to be located on a road outside of municipal boundaries, ODOT produces and installs the signs. Two markers are usually installed, one in each direction at each location. Once a set of signs is installed, there are typically no maintenance costs unless the signs are damaged. Signs usually need to be replaced every 12 to 15 years.
