## Bill Analysis

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### SUMMARY

- Generally requires food service operations to denote certain allergens on their menu.

### DETAILED ANALYSIS

#### Allergens on menu

The bill requires a food service operation to denote on its menu or menu board the food items that contain milk, eggs, fish, crustacean shellfish, tree nuts, peanuts, wheat, or soybeans. With respect to a catering food service operation, the operation must inform its patrons, in a reasonable manner, of the food items that include those allergens.<sup>1</sup>

Current law defines “food service operation” as a place, location, site, or separate area where food intended to be served in individual portions is prepared or served for a charge or required donation. “Food service operation” includes a restaurant, catering food service operation, food delivery sales operation, mobile food service operation (e.g., a food truck), seasonal food service operation, temporary food service operation, and vending machine location.<sup>2</sup>
