
### **Highlights**

- The bill declares the intent to create a grant program to support the development, repair, and upgrade of infrastructure that services housing in counties with populations less than 75,000.
- The bill does not provide a funding source or appropriation to support this program.

#### **Detailed Analysis**

The bill declares the intent to create a grant program to support the development, repair, and upgrade of infrastructure that services housing in counties with populations less than 75,000. The map below shows which 55 counties in Ohio would be population-eligible according to the United States 2020 Census. Under this program, counties, townships, and municipal corporations would be eligible to receive funding if the number of homes permitted to be built is below the state's county average. Eligibility under the building permit criteria would change as the United States Census Bureau releases new data. Funding under this grant program would be limited to infrastructure development, repair, and upgrades for parcels that are a quarter of an acre or smaller and zoned exclusively for single-family, residential dwellings.
