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## Fiscal Note & Local Impact Statement

**Bill:** H.B. 257 of the 132nd G.A.

**Subject:** Designates the Army Specialist David Lee Bingamon Memorial Highway

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As a result of the bill, the Ohio Department of Transportation (ODOT) will incur a minimal cost for producing and installing memorial signs. The bill designates a span of U.S. Route 68 within Brown County as the Army Specialist David Lee Bingamon Memorial Highway.

This proposed memorial highway is located along a roadway in an unincorporated part of Brown County. If a memorial highway begins or ends outside of a municipality, ODOT produces and installs the signs. According to ODOT, the cost of producing and installing a set of signs for memorial highways and bridges is approximately \$350 to \$400, including materials and labor. Two markers are usually installed, one in each direction at each location. Once a set of signs is installed, there are typically no maintenance costs unless the signs are damaged. Signs usually need to be replaced every 12 to 15 years.

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
