ACT SUMMARY

• Designates September 25 as "International Ataxia Awareness Day" in Ohio.

CONTENT AND OPERATION

The act designates September 25 as "International Ataxia Awareness Day" in Ohio.¹

Between one to two persons in every 100,000 globally are affected by ataxia – a group of degenerative neurological disorders characterized by impaired coordination of movement, vision, speech, hearing and other involuntary actions. In the United States, over 150,000 people are affected by ataxia.² Currently, there is no cure. Support organizations such as Living with Ataxia, American Ataxia Networking, and Ataxia-UK have adopted September 25 as International Ataxia Awareness Day as proposed by the
