#### **BILL SUMMARY**

Requires Medicaid to cover white canes as part of its coverage of durable medical equipment.

#### **CONTENT AND OPERATION**

## Medicaid coverage of white canes

The bill requires the Medicaid program to cover white canes as part of its coverage of durable medical equipment.1 White canes are a tool used by an individual who is blind or visually impaired to navigate the environment or for support.<sup>2</sup>

Existing administrative rules provide Medicaid reimbursement for specified durable medical equipment (DME),3 which is defined as equipment that can stand repeated use, is primarily and customarily used to serve a medical purpose, is not useful to a person in the absence of illness or injury, and is appropriate for use in the

home. Examples of DME currently included in the Medicaid program are hospital beds, wheelchairs, and ventilators. $^4$
