SUMMARY

 Appropriates \$125 million for Fiscal Year 2021 to the Development Services Agency to provide grants to bars, restaurants, and lodging businesses impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic.

DETAILED ANALYSIS

Appropriation to provide grants to impacted hospitality industry

The bill appropriates \$125 million for Fiscal Year 2021 to the Development Services Agency (DSA) to provide grants to bars, restaurants, and lodging industry businesses that have been impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic.

Grants to bars and restaurants

Under the bill, \$100 million of the appropriation must be used by DSA to provide grants to impacted bars and restaurants. Grants must be awarded (1) in amounts of \$10,000, \$20,000, and \$30,000 and (2) based on factors such as demonstrated loss of revenue and the number of employees eligible bars and restaurants employ.

Grants to lodging industry business

Under the bill, \$25 million must be used by DSA to provide grants for impacted lodging industry businesses. Grants must be awarded (1) in amounts of \$10,000, \$20,000, and \$30,000 and (2) based on factors such as a demonstrated loss of revenue and occupancy rates.¹
