## Highlights

Any fiscal impact will depend on the details of any future federal voluntary unemployment programs and whether or not the General Assembly adopts a concurrent resolution impacting Ohio's participation.

## **Detailed Analysis**

The bill allows the General Assembly to disapprove, by adopting a concurrent resolution, any agreement entered into or special or standing order issued by the Governor or the Director of Job and Family Services to implement a voluntary program created under any federal law providing for an increase in the weekly benefit amount, duration of benefits, total benefits payable, or other compensation, assistance, or allowances with respect to unemployment. The General Assembly may disapprove an agreement or order in whole or in part. If the General Assembly adopts a concurrent resolution, the Governor or the Director must rescind the agreement or special or standing order as soon as practicable. Any fiscal effects of the bill will depend on the details of any future federal voluntary unemployment programs and whether or not the General Assembly adopts a concurrent resolution impacting Ohio's participation.

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
