The bill is unlikely to have any fiscal effect on the state or political subdivisions. It disqualifies individuals who have failed to register with the Selective Service System in violation of the federal Military Selective Service Act from holding an appointed or elected position with state agencies, public institutions, political subdivisions, or any other organized body, office, agency, institution, or entity established by Ohio law for the exercise of any function of government. It also prohibits a person who fails to register with Selective Service from employment with a state agency, as defined by the bill. Under the bill, state agencies must verify that a candidate for employment is registered with Selective Service. Although this creates a new task for state agencies in the onboarding process for new employees, Selective Service registration verification is free and takes just a few seconds via the Selective Service System website using information already collected from candidates for employment.
