## Synopsis of House Committee Amendments\*

Sub. S.B. 158

132nd General Assembly (H. Aging and Long Term Care)

Adds five new members to the Elder Abuse Commission as composed under current law:

- A representative of the State Medical Board;
- A representative of the Community Bankers Association of Ohio;
- A representative of an organization representing the interests of senior centers;
- A representative of an organization representing the policy interests of seniors;
- A representative of a research-based academia representing elder abuse research.

Adds to the Elder Abuse Commission, as an ex officio member, the Director of Commerce or the Director's designee.

Adds the Securities Industry and Financial Markets Association to the list of entities included in the House-passed version that must be consulted in developing best practices and standards for preventing elder fraud and financial exploitation, providing education on the subject, and ensuring that services and resources are available to victims.

Makes a number of technical and conforming changes to the Adult Protective Services Law.
