Detailed Analysis

The bill designates the following highway and authorizes the Director of Transportation to erect suitable markers along the highway indicating its name:

| Designated Name | "SFC John E. Conger, Jr. Memorial Highway" ¹ |
|-------------------|--|
| Highway | The eastbound and westbound lanes of State Route (SR) 63, between the intersections of SR 741 and Neil Armstrong Way, in Warren County. |
| Other Information | SFC John E. Conger, Jr. was wounded by enemy fire on January 27, 1969 during a search and destroy mission in South Vietnam during the Vietnam War. Attempts to recover the wounded during the attack were unsuccessful. On October 13, 1969 the remains of the individuals wounded and missing with SFC Conger were recovered, but his remains were never found. He was considered MIA until July 31, 1978, when he was officially declared to be dead. He was posthumously promoted to SFC and has a memorial cemetery marker in Arlington National Cemetery. |
