The Ohio Department of Transportation (ODOT) will incur about \$350 to \$400 in costs for producing and installing memorial signs for this memorial highway. Specifically, the bill designates the portion of U.S. Route 62 between the intersections with Staunton-Sugar Grove Road and Greenfield Sabina Road within Fayette County as the PFC William Boggs, CPL Sam Boggs, and SGT Robert Boggs Memorial Highway.

If a memorial marker is to be located on a road outside of municipal boundaries, ODOT produces and installs the signs. Two markers are usually installed, one in each direction at each location. Once a set of signs is installed, there are typically no maintenance costs unless the signs are damaged. Signs usually need to be replaced every 12 to 15 years.
