SUMMARY

 Increases the penalty for gross abuse of a corpse from a fifth degree felony to a third degree felony.

DETAILED ANALYSIS

Gross abuse of a corpse

Under continuing law, no person, except as authorized by law, is permitted to treat a human corpse in a way that would outrage reasonable community sensibilities. A person who violates this provision is guilty of gross abuse of a corpse.

Penalties for gross abuse of a corpse

The bill increases the penalty for gross abuse of a corpse from a fifth degree felony to a third degree felony.1 A person who commits a fifth degree felony may be subject to a fine of up to \$2,500 and term of incarceration of 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, or 12 months. Alternatively, a person who commits a third degree felony may be subject to a fine of up to \$10,000 and a term of incarceration of 9, 12, 18, 24, 30, or 36 months.2
