## DETAILED ANALYSIS

## High school license plates

## Unique features

The bill creates three nonstandard license plates, representing three public high schools located in southwest Ohio. Features that are unique to each license plate are described in the following chart.

## "Fairfield Senior High School" license plate

| License Plate | Fairfield Senior High School license plate, which must display an appropriate <br> logo and words, selected by representatives of Fairfield Senior High School <br> and approved by the Registrar of Motor Vehicles. ${ }^{1}$ |

| Contribution; <br> Additional BMV Fee; <br> Use of Contribution | $\$ 30$ required contribution. <br> $\$ 10$ additional administrative BMV fee. <br> Contributions must be paid to Fairfield Senior High School in Fairfield, Ohio. <br> The school may not use these contributions for any political purpose. ${ }^{2}$ |

## "Hamilton High School" license plate

| License Plate | Hamilton High School license plate, which must display an appropriate logo <br> and words, selected by representatives of Hamilton High School and <br> approved by the Registrar. |
| :--- | :--- | :--- |
| Contribution; <br> Additional BMV Fee; <br> Use of Contribution | \$30 required contribution. <br> \$10 additional administrative BMV fee. <br> Contributions must be paid to Hamilton High School located in Hamilton, <br> Ohio. The school may not use these contributions for any political purpose. |

## Standard features

Features that are standard to all three license plates are described in the following table.
