SUMMARY

- Extends the temporary authority for public bodies to meet via electronic technology.
- Declares an emergency.

DETAILED ANALYSIS

Open meetings during COVID-19 emergency

The bill extends until June 30, 2021, the temporary authorization for a public body to hold and attend meetings and hearings by means of teleconference, video conference, or any other similar electronic technology. The authority originally was not to extend beyond December 1, 2020.¹ Continuing law generally requires public bodies to hold in-person meetings and hearings.²

The bill declares an emergency and therefore would take effect immediately.

COMMENT

After this bill was introduced, the temporary authorization was extended until July 1, 2021, by the enactment of H.B. 404 of the 133rd General Assembly.³
