The Ohio Department of Transportation (ODOT) will incur about \$500 in costs for producing and installing signs for this memorial highway. Specifically, the bill designates the eastbound and westbound lanes of I-275 between the intersections of that route and Winton Road and I-75 within Hamilton County as the Officer Kaia L. Grant Memorial Highway.

If a memorial marker is to be located on an interstate route, ODOT produces and installs the signs. Two markers are usually installed, one in each direction at each location. Once a set of signs is installed, there are typically no maintenance costs unless the signs are damaged. Signs usually need to be replaced every 12 to 15 years.
