## **Highlights**

The Ohio Department of Transportation (ODOT) will incur costs of approximately \$500 to produce the memorial signs for the designated portion of State Route 184. The city of Toledo will also incur minimal costs to install the signs provided by ODOT.

## **Detailed Analysis**

The Ohio Department of Transportation (ODOT) will incur approximately \$500 in costs for producing memorial signs for this memorial highway and the city of Toledo will incur minimal costs for installing them. Specifically, the bill designates the portion of State Route 184 (Alexis Road) between mile markers six and seven (near the intersection of Alexis Road and Lewis Avenue) in the city of Toledo within Lucas County as the Officer Anthony Dia Memorial Highway.

If a memorial marker is to be located within a municipality, ODOT produces the signs and may request reimbursement from the municipality for the cost. ODOT, however, does not currently seek this reimbursement. The signs are installed by municipal workers, though, resulting in minimal costs for the municipality where the memorial marker is to be located. Two markers are usually installed, one in each direction at each location. Once a set of signs is installed, there are typically no maintenance costs unless the signs are damaged. Signs usually need to be replaced every 12 to 15 years.
