The Ohio Department of Transportation (ODOT) will incur about \$500 in costs for producing and installing signs for this memorial highway. Specifically, the bill designates the northbound and southbound portion of I-71 between Second Street and Martin Luther King Drive within Hamilton County in the city of Cincinnati as the Officers Dennis Bennington and Robert Seiffert Memorial Highway.

If a memorial marker is to be located on an interstate route, ODOT produces and installs the signs. Two markers are usually installed, one in each direction at each location. Once a set of signs is installed, there are typically no maintenance costs unless the signs are damaged. Signs usually need to be replaced every 12 to 15 years.
