The bill has no direct fiscal effect on the state or political subdivisions. It makes changes to the law regarding the adoption, duration, and invalidation of emergency administrative rules. While the bill may result in some additional work for the staff of the Joint Committee on Agency Rule Review, it will have no discernible fiscal effect.

### Synopsis of Fiscal Effect Changes

The substitute bill (I\_134\_0395-3) removes several provisions in the As Introduced version of the bill that require an adopting agency to electronically file the final version of an emergency rule with the Common Sense Initiative Office (CSIO), as well as additional requirements placed on CSIO related to the filing of an emergency rule. The removal of these provisions reduces the work that otherwise would have been created for CSIO, and saving the agency potential related operating costs that are not readily quantifiable in terms of dollars and cents.

The substitute bill also adds provisions regarding the authority of the Joint Committee on Agency Rule Review (JCARR) as it pertains to the extension and invalidation of emergency rules. While these provisions may result in some additional work for JCARR staff, that work will be absorbed utilizing existing resources and the provisions will have no discernible fiscal effect.
