SUMMARY

 Exempts county utility supply contracts entered into under a joint purchasing program from the ten-year maximum period for such contracts.

DETAILED ANALYSIS

County utility supply contracts

The act allows county commissioners to enter into certain utility supply contracts for a period of more than ten years. Currently, county commissioners are prohibited from entering into utility supply contracts for a county building with a duration of more than ten years. Under the act, contracts entered into *under a joint purchasing program* are exempted from this requirement. A joint purchasing program enables local governments to jointly enter into contracts for the provision of goods or services: through another political subdivision's contract, through a joint purchasing program operated by a national or state association of political subdivisions, or through the federal government.¹
