The bill temporarily extends bar hours of operation and exempts bars from statewide curfew (see the LSC bill analysis for hours of operation). The extension of these hours does not appear to have any direct fiscal impact on the Division of Liquor Control within the Department of Commerce, nor political subdivisions. Bars are classified as those establishments with an A-1-A, A-1c, or class D permit. According to the most recent liquor permit records provided to LBO by the Division of Liquor Control, there are 342 A-1-A permits, 349 A-1c permits, and 27,077 D class permits. In addition, there are 12,846 D6 permits (Sunday sales of alcohol) that have been issued to other current permitted entities.
