The Ohio Department of Transportation (ODOT) will incur about \$500 in costs for producing and installing memorial signs for this memorial highway. Specifically, the bill designates a portion of State Route 19 between the intersection of that route and Link Road and that route and I-90 within Sandusky County as the Teresa Miller-Martin 9/11 Memorial Highway.

If a memorial marker is to be located on a road outside of municipal boundaries, ODOT produces and installs the signs. Two markers are usually installed, one in each direction at each location. Once a set of signs is installed, there are typically no maintenance costs unless the signs are damaged. Signs usually need to be replaced every 12 to 15 years.
