Synopsis of House Committee Amendments

S.B. 36 of the 134th General Assembly

House Criminal Justice

Time limitation for award of reparations

Modifies the time limitation to file an application for an award of reparations to three years after the criminally injurious conduct.

Provides exceptions to the above time limitation if any of the following apply:

- The claimant was under 21 years of age at the time of the criminally injurious conduct and the claim was filed by the claimant's 24th birthday.
- The claim is based on criminally injurious conduct that occurred prior to the effective date of the bill and was denied under the law as it existed prior to the effective date of the bill.
- The Attorney General makes an award of reparations for good cause shown.

Award of reparations while incarcerated

Provides that an award of reparations otherwise payable to a victim is not payable to the victim during any period that the victim is incarcerated.
