The Ohio Department of Transportation (ODOT) will incur about \$500 in costs for producing signs for this memorial highway and the city of Kettering will incur minimal costs for installing them. Specifically, the bill designates portions of State Route 48 between the intersections with Stroop Road and David Road in the city of Kettering within Montgomery County as the Sgt. Cameron H. Thomas Memorial Way. Secondly, the portions of State Route 48 between the intersections with David Road and Rahn Road in the city of Kettering within Montgomery County is designated the Sgt. Kevin J. Lannon Memorial Way.

If a memorial marker is to be located inside of a municipality, ODOT produces the signs and may request reimbursement from the municipality for the cost. ODOT, however, does not currently seek this reimbursement. The signs are installed by municipal workers, though, resulting in minimal costs for the municipality where the memorial marker is to be located. Two markers are usually installed for each highway, one in each direction at each location. Once a set of signs is installed, there are typically no maintenance costs unless the signs are damaged. Signs usually need to be replaced every 12 to 15 years.

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
