SUMMARY

Decreases, from six to three, the minimum number of poultry chicks under four weeks old that may be sold, given away, or otherwise distributed in a given lot.

DETAILED ANALYSIS

Poultry chicks

The bill decreases the minimum required lot size applicable to the sale of poultry chicks. Under current law, poultry chicks under four weeks old may be sold, given away, or otherwise distributed only in lots of at least six chicks. The bill reduces this required lot size to three chicks. Generally, poultry are domesticated fowl, including chickens, turkeys, geese, and ducks, raised for the production of meat or eggs.
