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### SUMMARY

#### **Congenital Heart Defect Awareness Week**

- Designates the week of February 7 to 14 as “Congenital Heart Defect Awareness Week.”

#### **Juneteenth as a paid legal holiday**

- Requires school districts to grant paid leave for Juneteenth Day to all regular nonteaching school employees who are employed on an eleven- or twelve-month basis, rather than those who are employed on a nine- or ten-month basis as currently required.

#### **Frontline Health Care Worker Pilot Program**

- Shortens the operation of the Frontline Health Care Worker Education, Training, and Certification Pilot Program, which was created under the Main Operating Budget, to FY 2022 only, and allocates the FY 2023 funding to NewBridge Cleveland Center for Arts and Technology, for the same purposes as the original pilot program.

## Juneteenth as a paid legal holiday

The bill requires school districts to grant paid leave for Juneteenth Day to all regular nonteaching school employees who are employed on an *eleven- or twelve-*month basis, rather than those who are employed on a nine- or ten-month basis as prescribed in current law.<sup>2</sup> H.B. 110 of the 134<sup>th</sup> General Assembly established June 19, known as Juneteenth, as a legal holiday for which certain government employees must receive paid leave and for which school districts may dismiss school. That act granted nine- or ten-month employees paid leave for that date but not ten- or eleven-month employees, which appears to be a drafting error.

## Frontline Health Care Worker Pilot Program

The bill shortens the operation of the Frontline Health Care Worker Pilot Program, which is to be operated in FY 2022 and FY 2023, pursuant to the Main Operating Budget. Under the pilot program, adult education institutions may be reimbursed for the cost of education and wraparound services provided to students of health care training programs.<sup>3</sup> The bill limits the pilot program's operation to FY 2022 only. Instead of operating the program in FY 2023 and reimbursing any adult education institution, the bill specifies that the FY 2023 funding is to be provided to NewBridge Cleveland Center for Arts and Technology, for the same purposes as the original pilot program. The bill also specifies that unexpended, unencumbered funds for the program in FY 2022 are to be reappropriated for FY 2023.<sup>4</sup>
