Highlights

- The bill will have a minimal effect on the workload and related annual operating costs of the probate divisions of courts of common pleas.
- The bill has no direct fiscal effect on the state.

Detailed Analysis

The bill makes various changes related to the law regarding cases generally under the subject matter jurisdiction of the probate divisions of the state's 88 courts of common pleas. The bill specifically amends the laws regarding the disinterment of bodies buried in cemeteries, conclusion of irrevocable trusts, methods for tangible personal property to transfer on death, records disclosures relating to settlement of claims for minors, and options a creditor has to present a claim against an estate. Collectively, these provisions will have a minimal fiscal impact on the probate courts, with any additional work and related operating expenses absorbed with existing staff and appropriated resources.
