The resolution does not have any fiscal impact on the state or political subdivisions. The resolution serves as an application for a federal convention of the states for the purpose of proposing amendments to the U.S. Constitution that would impose fiscal restraints on the federal government, limit the power and jurisdiction of the federal government, and institute term limits for federal offices. Unlike many other joint resolutions, this resolution does not seek to modify the state constitution and would therefore not be required to appear on the ballot of a specified election for a vote by the public. Consequently, there will be no ballot advertising costs incurred by the state, nor any costs to county boards of elections, to place the measure on the ballot.
