Vote required to amend the Ohio Constitution	
<p>Requires a constitutional amendment proposed by initiative petition to be approved by at least 60% of the voters, instead of a simple majority, in order to take effect. (<i>Ohio Const. art. II, sec. 1b and conforming changes in Ohio Const. art. II, secs. 1e and 1g.</i>)</p> <p>Maintains the requirement that a constitutional amendment proposed by the General Assembly or by a constitutional convention be approved by a simple majority of the voters in order to take effect. (<i>Ohio Const. art. XVI, secs. 1 and 3, not in the resolution.</i>)</p>	<p>Requires <i>any</i> proposed constitutional amendment to be approved by at least 60% of the voters, instead of a simple majority, in order to take effect. (<i>Ohio Const. art. II, sec. 1b and art. XVI, secs. 1 and 3; conforming changes in Ohio Const. art. II, secs. 1e and 1g.</i>)</p>
