# **Synopsis of Senate Committee Amendments**

#### H.B. 23 of the 134th General Assembly

#### **Dementia training for peace officers**

Modifies the bill's requirement that the Attorney General adopt rules establishing the number of hours of dementia-related training that are required for completion of basic training programs offered at peace officer training schools and continued professional training, from a minimum of two hours for initial training and one hour for continued training, to an amount to be determined in accordance with guidance from the Ohio Peace Officer Training Commission (OPOTC), if needed.

Specifies that the amount of dementia-related training determined in accordance with guidance from OPOTC cannot exceed two hours for initial training and one hour for continued training.<sup>1</sup>

### Maximum age for newly appointed state highway patrol

Adds a provision that increases the maximum age authorized for a newly appointed state highway patrol trooper from 35 to 40 years old.<sup>2</sup>
