• Designates November as "Alpha-1 Antitrypsin Deficiency Awareness Month."

CONTENT AND OPERATION

Alpha-1 Antitrypsin Deficiency Awareness Month

The bill designates the month of November as "Alpha-1 Antitrypsin Deficiency Awareness Month." Alpha-1 antitrypsin deficiency is a condition in which the body does not make enough of a protein that protects the lungs and liver from damage. It is caused by a genetic defect and can lead to emphysema and liver disease.²
