ACT SUMMARY

Designates the second week of September as "Krabbe Disease Awareness Week."

CONTENT AND OPERATION

The act designates the second week of September as "Krabbe Disease Awareness Week" to raise awareness of the disease, which is also known as globoid cell leukodystrophy. The act states that Krabbe disease is a life-threatening, inherited disorder that destroys the protective coating of nerve cells in the brain and nervous system, typically resulting in complications that include seizures, muscle spasms, muscle deterioration, blindness, deafness, and respiratory failure.¹
