## CONTENT AND OPERATION

## Global War on Terrorism Civilian Service Medal

The bill creates the following license plate (R.C. 4503.536):

| Special License Plate | Global War on Terrorism Civilian Service Medal license <br> plate, which must be inscribed with appropriate words <br> indicating the applicable award and must bear a <br> reproduction of the Global War on Terrorism Civilian <br> Service Medal (provided the U.S. Department of Defense <br> grants approval to include the reproduction). |

| Recipients | Available to anyone who has been awarded the Global War <br> on Terrorism Civilian Service Medal. |
| Eligible Vehicles | Any passenger car, noncommercial motor vehicle, <br> recreational vehicle, or other vehicle approved by the <br> Registrar of Motor Vehicles. |
| Contribution and Additional <br> BMV Fee | No required contribution. <br> No additional BMV fee. |
| Use of Contribution | Not applicable. |
| Requirements for Issuance | (1) Submission of an application and satisfactory evidence <br> documenting that the applicant is a recipient of the Global <br> War on Terrorism Civilian Service Medal; |
|  | (2) Payment of the regular license tax, any applicable local <br> tax, any applicable special reserved license plate fee; and |
| (3) Compliance with all other applicable laws relating to |  |
| motor vehicle registration. |  |


| Combined with Special <br> Reserved License Plate | May be combined with a special reserved license plate <br> provided in current law. |
| :--- | :--- |
| Applicability of License Plate <br> Termination Procedures | Procedures governing the termination of nonstandard <br> license plates do not apply. |

## Falsifying an application for the "Global War on Terrorism Civilian Service Medal" license plate

The bill prohibits any person who is not a recipient of the Global War on Terrorism Civilian Service Medal from willfully and falsely representing that the person is such a recipient for the purpose of obtaining the license plates. The bill also prohibits any person from permitting a motor vehicle owned or leased by the person to bear such license plates unless the person is eligible to be issued such license plates. Under the criminal code, a person who commits such a violation may be found guilty of falsification. ${ }^{1}$ Generally, falsification is a first degree misdemeanor. ${ }^{2}$
