SUMMARY

- Permits a student to fulfill the financial literacy graduation requirement through an advanced placement course in business with personal finance.

DETAILED ANALYSIS

Financial literacy course requirement

The bill permits a student to fulfill the financial literacy course requirement through the successful completion of an advanced placement (AP) course in business with personal finance. Continuing law permits a student to also fulfill that requirement with an AP course in microeconomics or macroeconomics.

State law requires students enrolled in public schools or attending chartered nonpublic schools using a state scholarship to complete one-half unit of instruction in financial literacy to graduate from high school. The student must choose to complete the one-half unit of instruction either in place of one-half unit of math instruction or as one of the student's electives. One-half unit of instruction is a minimum of 60 hours of course instruction.¹
