### **State Fiscal Highlights**

• The Ohio Department of Transportation (ODOT) will incur costs of approximately \$350 to \$400 per sign, including materials and labor, to install appropriate markers on or near the eastbound span of the Innerbelt bridge on Interstate Route 90 in Cuyahoga County.

### **Local Fiscal Highlights**

• No direct fiscal effect on political subdivisions.

#### **Detailed Fiscal Analysis**

The bill amends an already enacted section of the Revised Code (section 5533.359) that designates the bridge on Interstate 90 spanning the Cuyahoga River in Cuyahoga County as the George V. Voinovich Bridge. The bill requires the Ohio Department of Transportation (ODOT) to install markers on or near *both* the eastbound and the westbound bridges that carry traffic on I-90 over the river. As part of a large Major New construction project, ODOT is replacing the one Innerbelt bridge in Cleveland on I-90 with two bridges. The westbound bridge has been completed, while the eastbound span is under construction. When a bridge is designated as a memorial, ODOT typically installs a marker in each direction along the approaches to the bridge. According to ODOT, the cost of installing signs for memorial highways and bridges is approximately \$350 to \$400 per sign, including materials and labor. Once a set of signs is installed, typically there are no maintenance costs unless the signs are knocked down or damaged. Signs are usually in need of replacement every 12 to 15 years.
