H.B. 214 131st General Assembly (As Introduced)

BILL SUMMARY

- Generally prohibits a public authority from preferring one type of suitable piping material over another in constructing, developing, maintaining, rebuilding, improving, repairing, or operating a water, waste water, or storm water drainage project that receives state funding.
- Allows such preference if sound engineering practices suggest one type of suitable piping material is more appropriate for a particular project.

CONTENT AND OPERATION

The bill prohibits a public authority from preferring one type of suitable piping material over another in constructing, developing, maintaining, rebuilding, improving, repairing, or operating a water, waste water, or storm water drainage project that receives state funding unless sound engineering practices suggest that one type of suitable piping material is more appropriate for a particular project.¹

For purposes of the prohibition, a public authority includes the state, a county, municipal corporation, water or sewer district, school district, or other political subdivision, or any public agency, authority, board, commission, instrumentality, or state or local special purpose district.² Suitable piping material is piping material that both meets or exceeds standards issued by the American Society for Testing and

Materials or the American Water Works Association and meets the specifications of a project described in the prohibition.³
