

## **Ohio Legislative Service Commission**

Synopsis of Senate Committee Amendments\*

Sub. H.B. 110 131st General Assembly (S. Criminal Justice)

Replaces the provision in the House-passed version of the bill that increased the penalty for failure to stop after an accident and failure to stop after a nonpublic road accident from a fifth or third degree felony to a second degree felony if the accident causes serious physical harm to or the death of another with provisions that increase the penalty for those offenses as follows:<sup>1</sup>

- If the accident results in serious physical harm to another, increases the penalty from a fifth degree felony to a fourth degree felony if the offender knew that the accident resulted in serious physical harm;
- If the accident results in the death of another, increases the penalty from a third degree felony to a second degree felony if the offender knew that the accident caused the death.

Adds a provision that requires specified emergency medical service personnel who administer naloxone due to an actual or suspected drug overdose to disclose, upon request of a law enforcement agency, specified information about an individual who was administered the naloxone, unless the personnel reasonably believes that the agency does not have jurisdiction over the place where the naloxone was administered.<sup>2</sup>
