Fiscal Note & Local Impact Statement

Bill: H.B. 276 of the 131st G.A. (LSC 131 0327-4) **Date:** April 11, 2016

Status: In House Health and Aging **Sponsor:** Rep. Schuring

Local Impact Statement Procedure Required: No

Contents: Authorizes chiropractors to engage in certain activities involving nutrition-related items and therapies, nonprescription drugs, and medical goods and devices

State Fiscal Highlights

- Minimal increase in administrative costs for the Ohio State Chiropractic Board to adopt rules related to the provisions of the bill; the Board expects these costs to be absorbed by its existing budget.

Local Fiscal Highlights

- No direct fiscal effect on political subdivisions.

Detailed Fiscal Analysis

The bill authorizes chiropractors to administer, sell, distribute, recommend, or provide advice regarding various nutritional supplements, homeopathic remedies, nonprescription drugs, and medical goods and devices. The Ohio State Chiropractic Board anticipates a minimal increase in administrative costs to adopt rules related to this change and a possible increase in complaints or disciplinary action related to expanded services, but any costs will be absorbed within the Board's existing budget.

Synopsis of Fiscal Effect Changes

The substitute bill (LSC 131 0327-4) modifies the bill's authorizations for chiropractors to administer, sell, recommend, or provide advice regarding various nutritional supplements, homeopathic remedies, nonprescription drugs, and medical goods and devices. These modifications would not change the fiscal effect.
