Synopsis of House Committee Amendments*

Sub. S.B. 213 131st General Assembly (H. Government Accountability and Oversight)

Eliminates a provision for a boutique services registration fee.

Eliminates a provision that enables applicants to take a licensing examination before having completed the necessary training requirements.

Retains the amount of training hours required under current law for the various branches of cosmetology.

Authorizes the State Board of Cosmetology to issue a pre-examination work permit to applicants for a cosmetology instructor license.

Establishes that the test materials, examinations, or evaluation tools used for the instructor examinations become a public record after 15 years.

Requires that the act of shampooing be done under the supervision of an individual licensed under Cosmetology Law.

Clarifies that an applicant for an instructor license must pass the instructor examination in order to be issued a license by the Board.
