ACT SUMMARY

Designates April as "Osteopathic Medicine Recognition Month."

CONTENT AND OPERATION

The act designates April as "Osteopathic Medicine Recognition Month." It describes the designation as being in honor of the significant contributions made by the osteopathic field of medicine to improve the health of Ohioans.¹

According to the American Osteopathic Association, doctors of osteopathic medicine, or DOs, receive special training in the musculoskeletal system, muscles, and bones. Osteopathic physicians focus on preventative health care and practice a "whole person" approach to medicine.²
