

## OHIO LEGISLATIVE SERVICE COMMISSION

Synopsis of House Committee Amendments\*

Sub. S.B. 227 131st General Assembly (H. State Government)

Eliminates the bill's addition of an exemption for "personal information" under the Public Records Law (this exemption was previously enacted by H.B. 317 of the 131st General Assembly, effective September 28, 2016).

Eliminates the bill's Study Committee on Restructuring Gaming Enforcement.

Removes a provision that provided that *any* attempt to violate the Solid and Hazardous Wastes Law, rather than an attempted violation of that Law *relating to hazardous wastes*, is a felony.

Adds to the bill's provision that requires a court that seals a person's criminal conviction record to order the person to be fingerprinted by a sheriff, that fingerprinting be ordered only if the person was not previously fingerprinted at the time of arrest, arraignment, or first appearance, as evidenced by a record of the fingerprints provided by a probation officer or county department of probation when forwarding a written report about the person to the court that is sealing the record.

Adds two actions that prevent a judgment from going dormant, whether in favor of the state or not, including a judgment in a county other than that in which a judgment was rendered: (1) an order of garnishment that is issued or is continuing, or until the last garnishment payment is received by the court clerk or the garnishee files the final report, whichever is later, and (2) a proceeding in aid of execution that is commenced or is continuing.
