Synopsis of House Committee Amendments*

Modifies the prohibitions against selling a firearm to a person under age 18 or selling a handgun to a person under age 21 to clarify that they do not apply to the *sale or furnishing* of a handgun to a person who is an active duty member of the U.S. armed forces who has sufficient firearms training under the bill.

Adds a provision directing the Attorney General to create and maintain a section on its website that provides information on state firearms laws specifically applicable to military members.

Specifies that an employer may not discharge without just cause, refuse to hire, or discriminate against a person who holds a valid concealed handgun license regarding employment-related matters, on the basis that the person possessed a firearm within the person's private real property or within a motor vehicle located on the employer's premises.

Allows a person to file a charge with the Civil Rights Commission alleging that another person has engaged in or is engaging in an unlawful discriminatory practice by making decisions regarding that person's employment on the basis described above and allows the Civil Rights Commission to investigate and remediate that unlawful discriminatory practice.
