S.B. 193 131st General Assembly (As Introduced)

BILL SUMMARY

- Prohibits the sale of cosmetics or personal care products containing microbeads, which are micro-polymer particles, less than five millimeters in diameter, that are made of synthetic or semi-synthetic polymeric materials.
- Establishes a civil fine of up to \$1,000 for each day of violation and, for a subsequent violation, a civil fine of up to \$2,500 for each day of violation.
- Authorizes the Director of Agriculture to adopt rules necessary to implement the bill.

CONTENT AND OPERATION

Microbeads

The bill prohibits the sale of cosmetics or personal care products containing microbeads.¹ Microbeads are micro-polymer particles, less than five millimeters in diameter, that are made of synthetic or semi-synthetic polymeric materials such as polyethylene, polypropylene, or a combination of such polymers. Personal care products are consumer products manufactured for use in personal hygiene and beautification, such as anti-bacterial soaps, lotions, and toothpastes.² A person who violates the bill is subject to a civil fine of up to \$1,000 for each day of violation and, for a subsequent violation, a civil fine of up to \$2,500 for each day of violation.³

The bill authorizes the Director of Agriculture to adopt rules that the Director considers necessary to implement the bill.⁴
