Sub. Bill Comparative Synopsis

Am. Sub. S.B. 7 132nd General Assembly (H. Criminal Justice)

This table summarizes how the latest substitute version of the bill differs from the immediately preceding version. It addresses only the topics on which the two versions differ substantively. It does not list topics on which the two bills are substantively the same.

Topic	Previous Version (As Passed by the Senate)	Sub. Version (L-132-0219-2)
Notice of protection order	Provides that, in a prosecution for violating a protection order or consent agreement, it is not necessary to prove that the defendant was served the order or agreement if the prosecution proves that the defendant had actual notice of the order or agreement and recklessly violated its terms (<i>R.C. 2919.27(D)</i>).	Provides that, in a prosecution for violating a protection order or consent agreement, it is not necessary to prove that the defendant was served the order or agreement if the prosecution proves that the defendant was shown the order or agreement or a copy of either, or a judge, magistrate, or law enforcement officer informed the defendant that a protection order or consent agreement had been issued, and proves that the defendant recklessly violated its terms (<i>R.C. 2919.27(D)</i>).
