BILL SUMMARY

Creates a statutory definition of "microbusiness."

CONTENT AND OPERATION

The bill creates a statutory definition of "microbusiness." Under the bill, a "microbusiness" is an independently owned and operated for-profit business entity, including any affiliates, that is located in Ohio and has fewer than 20 full-time employees or full-time equivalent employees. Currently, the term "microbusiness" does not appear to be used in the Revised Code.

For purposes of the bill, a "full-time employee" is an employee who, with respect to a calendar month, is employed an average of at least 30 hours of service per week. The number of full-time equivalent employees for a calendar month is determined by calculating the aggregate number of hours of service for that calendar month for employees who were not full-time employees, and dividing that number by 120.¹
