## Fiscal Note & Local Impact Statement

**Subject:** Designates John Glenn's childhood home as a state historic site

---

The bill requires the Ohio History Connection (OHC) to designate John Glenn's childhood home in New Concord, Ohio as a state historic site and appropriately mark the site, or cause the site to be marked, as such. The bill appears to have no direct fiscal effect on the state or political subdivisions, as OHC added the site to the state's network of designated historic sites and museums in August 2016. The site houses the John and Annie Glenn Museum, which is managed locally by the Museum Association of East Muskingum in partnership with OHC.

OHC is a state-chartered nonprofit corporation that receives state subsidies for various purposes, including management of state historic sites and museums. H.B. 49 of the 132nd General Assembly appropriates GRF funding of \$5.8 million in both FY 2018 and FY 2019 in line item 360502, Site and Museum Operations, to support the management of most designated sites and museums and additional funding for certain other sites and museums through separate appropriations.
