## H.B. 423

132nd General Assembly (As Introduced)

### BILL SUMMARY

- Prohibits wearing a mask or disguise in order to purposely obstruct the execution of the law, intimidate a person who is performing a legal duty, or prevent a person from exercising rights granted by the Constitution or the laws of Ohio.
- Classifies "masked intimidation" as a first degree misdemeanor.

## **CONTENT AND OPERATION**

#### **Masked intimidation**

The bill prohibits a person from wearing a mask or disguise in order to purposely do any of the following:

(1) Obstruct the execution of the law;

(2) Intimidate, hinder, or interrupt a person in the performance of the person's legal duty; or

(3) Prevent a person from exercising the rights granted by the Constitution or the laws of Ohio.

The bill names the offense "masked intimidation" and classifies it as a first degree misdemeanor.<sup>1</sup> Existing law, unchanged by the bill, prohibits a person from uniting with two or more others to commit a misdemeanor while wearing white caps, masks, or

other disguise. A person who violates the existing prohibition is guilty of a fourth degree felony.<sup>2</sup>
