ACT SUMMARY

- Designates 28 new memorial highways, one new bridge, and one new picnic area.
- Creates 21 new nonstandard license plates and amends two continuing nonstandard license plates.

CONTENT AND OPERATION

Designations

The act designates the following highways, a bridge, and a picnic area. It authorizes the Director of Transportation to erect suitable markers along the highways and bridges, and requires the Chief of the Division of Parks and Watercraft to erect suitable markers in the picnic area.

Nonstandard license plates

The act creates 21 new nonstandard license plates. For 19 of the new license plates, which are available to the general public, the act requires a person to pay an annual contribution of varying amounts when the license plate is issued or renewed. Contributions must be deposited into the License Plate Contribution Fund. (Contributions for the "Post-Traumatic Stress" license plate must be deposited in the Post-Traumatic Stress License Plate Contribution Fund.) A person also must pay an additional annual \$10 Bureau of Motor Vehicles (BMV) fee. The additional fee must be deposited into the Public Safety – Highway Purposes Fund and used by BMV for its additional services in issuing the nonstandard plates. For the "Line of Duty Sacrifice" and "Ohio National Guard Ohio Cross" license plates, which are not available to the general public, no contribution or BMV fee is required. All other registration requirements apply to the issuance of all 21 of the new plates.

Generally, the new license plates may be issued for passenger cars, noncommercial motor vehicles, recreational vehicles, and any other vehicle of a class approved by the Registrar of Motor Vehicles. However, the "Kenston Local Schools" license plate and the "Cuyahoga Valley Career Center" license plate also may be issued for motorcycles, cab-enclosed motorcycles, and any motor-driven cycle or motor scooter. The new license plates are set forth in the following chart, which includes a description of each license plate:

Failure to submit the report will result in the contributions being redirected to the GRF.⁷¹

The act redirects the contributions for the "Juvenile Diabetes Research Foundation" license plate to the Foundation's Central Ohio Chapter, which must distribute them to the various Foundation chapters based on the geographic territory of the persons who paid the contributions. Former law required the Registrar to distribute the contributions directly to each of the various chapters.⁷⁴

Finally, the act removes operators of commercial motor vehicles as potential applicants for the "Westerville Parks Foundation" license plate.⁷⁵
