Subject: Designates the World War I and World War II Veterans Memorial Bridge

The Ohio Department of Transportation (ODOT) will incur about \$350 to \$400 in costs for producing and installing memorial signs for this memorial bridge. Specifically, the bill designates the bridge spanning Squaw Creek on State Route 169 within Trumbull County as the World War I and World War II Veterans Memorial Bridge. The bridge lies in an unincorporated part of Trumbull County.

If a memorial marker is to be located along a roadway outside of a municipality, ODOT produces and installs the signs. According to ODOT, the cost of producing and installing a set of signs for memorial highways and bridges is approximately \$350 to \$400, including materials and labor. Two markers are usually installed, one in each direction at each location. Once a set of signs is installed, there are typically no maintenance costs unless the signs are damaged. Signs usually need to be replaced every 12 to 15 years.

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
